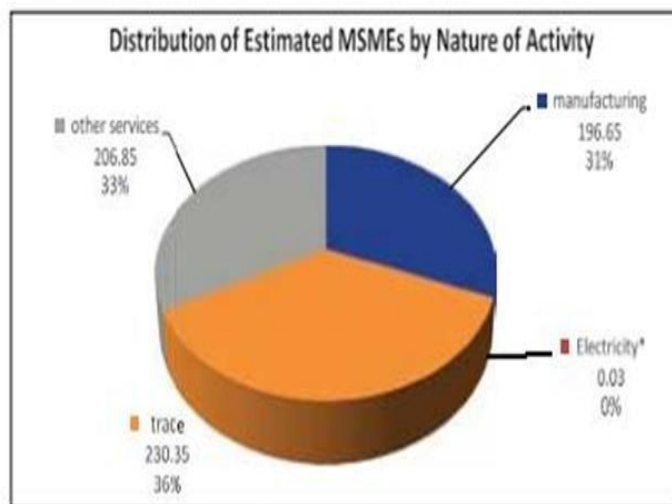

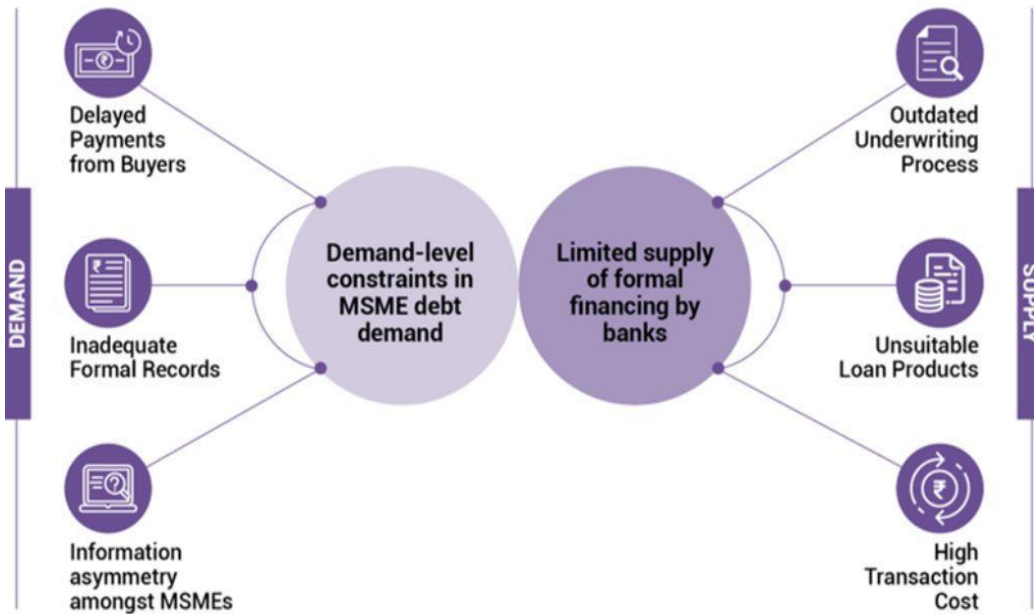

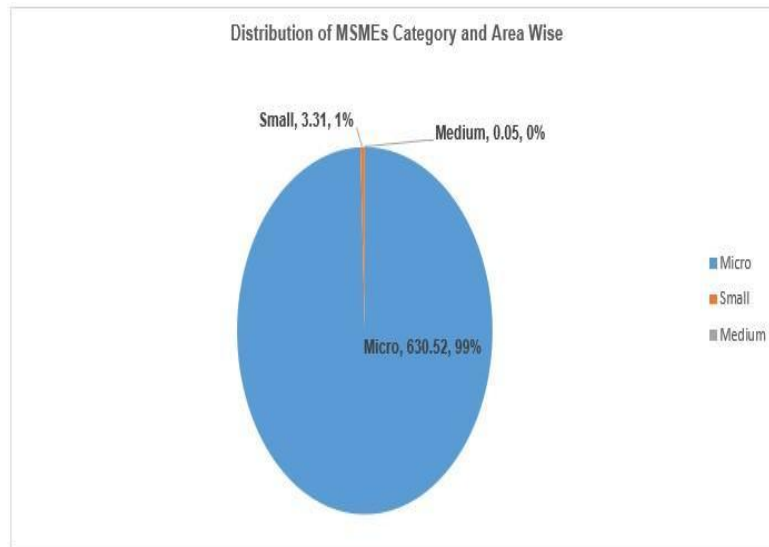

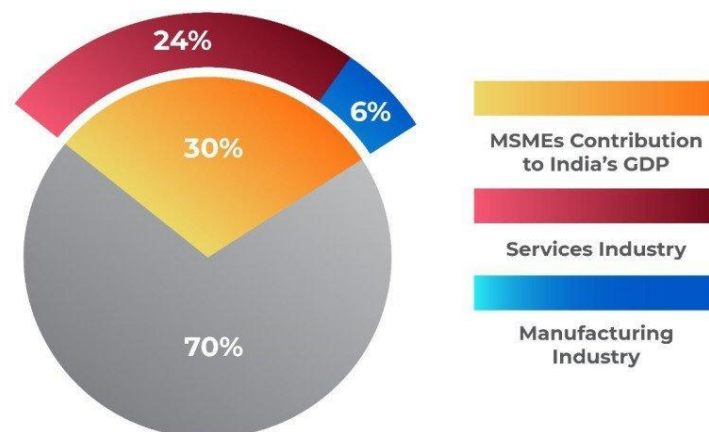
**Graph 3.1: Growth Trend of MSMEs in Tamil Nadu**



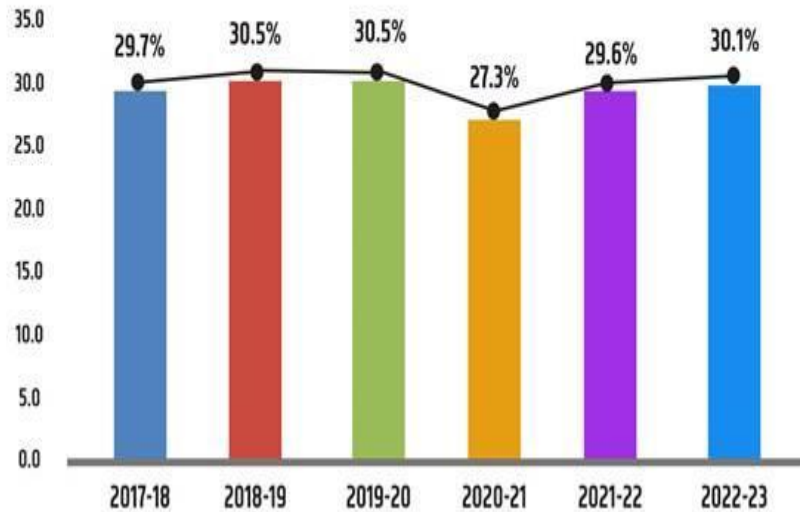
